Business groups consist of a collection of legally independent firms that are partly or wholly owned by a single family or firm that controls the member firms' assets.

Business groups are widespread in both emerging and developed economies and account for a large fraction of the economic activity in many of the countries where they are active.

Despite their high profiles in numerous countries and their prevalence and importance in the global economy as a whole, they remain a phenomenon yet to be fully understood.

The Lectio Inauguralis will provide a unique combination of academic and management-related perspectives as it attempts to analyze the main trade-offs determining the structure of such groups as well as the reasons why affiliated firms may respond to shocks differently from stand-alone firms. The Lectio represents the first step of a wider research agenda aimed at addressing broader questions such as the causes that determine the formation and the evolution of groups over time and their impact on social efficiency.
