


#### **Letter from the Chairman**

In 2021, as in the previous year, Italy's entire education system continued to suffer from the emergency situation caused by Covid-19. We didn't have another lockdown like in 2020 and the extended periods of school closures gradually lessened over time, but Italy was still one of the developed countries to suspend in-person lessons for the highest number of weeks, second only to the United States. Furthermore, the many months where students could attend classes only in fits and starts aggravated the wounds inflicted in 2020, which our children will carry with them for a long time, leading to learning losses and stunted social relationships.

The 2021 Social Report Fondazione Agnelli now presents to all of its stakeholders – and, first of all, to the world of Italian education – is obviously impacted by this difficult situation.

Our commitment in the field continued with projects – which we'd already launched in 2020 – to directly alleviate the damage made by the pandemic to the most fragile students. Above all, the Arcipelago Educativo initiative we carried out with Save the Children offered educational activities during both the summer and the school year to help boys and girls with different types of difficulties, reaching a total of 2,200 students in 6 cities. We also worked on projects that focused on the hardships brought along by the pandemic indirectly. One of them was the new edition of the Combo Lab educational initiative on STEM subjects, which now brings RoboSpazio – a workshop on maths, physics and robotics conducted by educators at Comau, whom we've partnered with for years – to secondary schools across Italy, remotely.

One of our new projects was carried out in collaboration with Exor companies: to increase the effectiveness of their ESG policies and of the projects they promote in the world of education, Fondazione Agnelli provided training to different company managers, sharing with them the experience it has developed over

many years at work in the field.

In 2021, we also completed a very important research project. The second report on junior secondary schools in Italy, published 10 years after the first edition, revisits the reasons behind the difficulties of this specific school segment, which deeply affects one of the most delicate and critical stages in children's development. The report was designed to be entirely in digital format for the first time, and garnered considerable interest from the world of education as well as from institutions.

Lastly, our analysis of school policies and advocacy was more relevant than ever, as it focused on Italy's National Recovery and Resilience Plan. As we know, the NRRP resources provided by Europe offer the country a unique opportunity to improve the quality of its education: the goal is to give all students ways to access wellbeing and participation in civic life, thus helping the country to grow, innovate and raise its competitive edge. It is an opportunity we cannot afford to miss, requiring joint efforts from all the players involved. Fondazione Agnelli is making its contribution by providing critical analyses of the initiatives for education included in the NRRP and of the proposals for school reforms that must accompany it.

The Foundation confirms its commitment to these objectives also for the months to come, especially as the current social and economic context becomes more complex due to the international geopolitical situation. I am personally convinced that increasing the quality and effectiveness of our schools, at all levels, is always the best choice, to prepare our girls and boys for the challenges of today and those to come.
