Letter from the Chairman

In 2022, Italian students steadily and regularly returned to their classrooms thanks to the success of the vaccines developed against the pandemic that, for almost two years, had kept them away from normal school routines. For anyone who cares about the Italian education system – including us, of course – it was a long-awaited moment and a great satisfaction.

At Fondazione Agnelli, it was also the moment to finally draw to a close the various projects we had started in 2020 and 2021 with the precise goal of helping schools cope with the Covid emergency. Thus, a new phase opened in 2022 in continuity with the research and activities we carried out prior to the pandemic, yet with a particular focus on understanding the aftermath of these difficult and exceptional years on schools and students. And, more importantly, on the ways we might remedy the damage. It quickly became clear to us that, on the one hand, almost all the problems present in Italian schools originated further back in time and preceded Covid; on the other hand, however, the pandemic had exacerbated some of the existing issues.

In particular, we decided to focus on a phenomenon that has affected students and schools around the world, not only in Italy, fuelling concerns about the future of the younger generations that have been most impacted by Covid. I am talking about the learning losses in core subjects – such as Italian and maths – that school closures have caused for everyone, but especially for the most fragile students. This phenomenon has intensified more than ever the geographical, social and gender gaps that make Italian schools so different from city to city, region to region. A fact that stands in stark contrast to our goal of lending a hand so that the quality of education in our country may be excellent everywhere, doing everything in our power to improve the situation anywhere we can identify the greatest problems.

While our research focuses perforce on the least satisfactory aspects of education in Italy, the projects and tangible initiatives

Fondazione Agnelli carries out every year are emblematic of our optimism regarding the results and improvements we can achieve in collaboration with schools, teachers, students and their families. This seems to be particularly evident looking at the renewal of didactics: an aspect that gave us great satisfaction in 2022. For example, thanks to a scientifically rigorous assessment, we learned that the educational approach of Arcipelago Educativo - a project designed with Save the Children to contrast learning losses that harm the most fragile students - performed above and beyond our expectations. And, furthermore, that it could be replicated by other organisations, in different contexts and situations as well. In addition, we launched two new projects for didactic innovation in the field of STEM subjects, which are currently in progress: Matabì with Politecnico di Torino and Exor, aiming to teach maths to primary school children with a tangible and fun method, paired with careful attention for gender differences; and HOP (Hands on Physics) with CERN and INFN, introducing a new kind of physics and the scientific method already in junior secondary schools. Allow me to end my letter for this 2022 Social Report by emphasising the efforts made by Fondazione Agnelli to not only reflect and analyse, but also to dialogue with Europe and the different levels of the Italian government about some of the themes at the heart of the National Recovery and Resilience Plan (NRRP, or Piano nazionale di ripresa e resilienza): teacher training, school building, and guidance for youths as they decide their next steps. In these post-pandemic times, the NRRP is providing Italian schools and universities with unprecedented resources destined to crucial investments. It is a huge effort that strengthens our sense of belonging to Europe and confirms Fondazione Agnelli made the right choice 15 years ago, deciding to make a useful contribution to improve schools in Italy. A goal that is not only our mission, but also our passion.
